



What is a Regional Knowledge Strategy?

There has never been greater public investment in natural resource management (NRM) in Australia or in research that provides the information and knowledge to improve it. The Program aims to facilitate better links between the 56 regional NRM bodies and knowledge providers, and to assist regional bodies to better manage their information and knowledge.

A Regional Knowledge Strategy can help the board and staff of NRM regions to:

- Develop a common understanding of how they can enhance their capability to create, share and use information and knowledge;
- Cope with the exponential explosion in information;
- Respond to requests and issues more quickly and effectively;
- Share learnings and avoid 'reinventing the wheel'; and
- Prioritise current and future R&D needs.
